### Luke 19:1-10

- <sup>1</sup> Jesus entered Jericho and was passing through. <sup>2</sup> A man was there by the name of Zacchaeus; he was a chief tax collector and was wealthy.
- <sup>3</sup> He wanted to see who Jesus was, but because he was short he could not see over the crowd. <sup>4</sup> So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore-figtree to see him, since Jesus was coming that way.
- <sup>5</sup> When Jesus reached the spot, he looked up and said to him, "Zacchaeus, come down immediately. I must stay at your house today." So he came down at once and welcomed him gladly.
- <sup>7</sup> All the people saw this and began to mutter, "He has gone to be the guest of a sinner."
- <sup>8</sup> But Zacchaeus stood up and said to the Lord, "Look, Lord! Here and now I give half of my possessions to the poor, and if I have cheated anybody out of anything, I will pay back four times the amount."
- <sup>9</sup> Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house, because this man, too, is a son of Abraham. <sup>10</sup> For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost."

5-7 – How did Jesus interact with Zaccheus differently than others? How did Zaccheus react? How did the crowds react?

### Transformed by Grace (8-10)

Luke 18:24-27 – The Rich Ruler's actions revealed his lack of faith. Luke 19:8-9 – Zaccheus's actions demonstrate his salvation. What led him to this transformation? What did Jesus do first?

Ephesians 2:8-10, Romans 5:8, 1 John 4:19 – In true Christianity, what comes first? God's actions or ours? Why and how do we get this mixed up?

### On the Offensive

1 Tim 2:4 - Do you believe that God can, & wants to save all people?

Matthew 28:19-20 – Do you believe that you can have a part to play in His work?

Pray – Are you like Zaccheus? Is Jesus calling you? Or, who is the Zaccheus in your life, who just needs an invitation?
